SUMMARY

- Personnel from the DOD Air Carrier Survey and Analysis Office conducted an initial survey of Korean Air (KAL) at the company's headquarters in Seoul, Korea, on 26-30 June 1995.
- This survey was conducted at the request of United States Transportation Command.
- KAL flies various models of B-747, MD-11, DC-10, A-300, B-727, MD-82, and F-100, with 100 aircraft in their fleet; operates essentially worldwide.
- KAL satisfies all DOD Commercial Air Carrier Quality and Safety Requirements.

RECOMMENDATION

Recommend Korean Air be found capable of providing airlift services to the DOD.
